Contemplated Change Orders on the bid form. This would also apply to any job where there may be a conflict with hourly rates. Understand that your bid submission is your contract at time of tender. If there is no stipulated pricing or language in your submission for changes then you may have an issue. Your submission is your legal contract until a CCDC or other contractual document is presented to you for your review and acceptance. By The Numbers

The City of Ottawa issued at total of 145 NON-RESIDENTIAL permits in March 2019 totalling \$44,912,820.00 (including new construction and renovations). A total of 433 RESIDENTIAL permits were issued in March, 2019. The value of those permits equaled \$183, 373,014.00.

Across Canada

Canadian municipalities issued \$7.8 billion worth of building permits in February, down 5.7% from the previous month. Statistics Canada reported the decline was largely due to lower intentions for multi- family dwellings. Municipalities issued \$2.9 billion worth of non-residential permits in February, edging down 0.5% from January. Institutional permits rose 11.6%, the first increase in 5 month. Residential permits declined 8.5% to \$4.9 billion, the lowest level since April 2017.
