IBEW Announces Changes To Stabilization Fund

For members of ECA Ottawa who use the Stabilization Fund please take immediately note of the following important changes:

- 1. Starting **October 1, 2020** all members using the stabilization fund will have <u>90 days to report</u> the status of your stab request. (won or lost) If you do not inform the IBEW within this 90 day window, your stabilization stab request will be closed and the funding will be **forfeit**!
- 2. All invoices are to be submitted on a MONTHLY basis. The IBEW will not pay if submitted quarterly, every six months or yearly. The funding will be forfeited.
- 3. If stab request is submitted LATE, no stab will be given.
- 4. If a stab job gets extended to a new date, do not enter a new request in the database. Go on the system and **CHANGE** the date to the new closing date. Do not assume the stab amount allotted will be the same on the new closing date. If you do not change the date, the amount may not be honored.

Please ensure you are aware of these changes!!!!

Get The Covid App - ECA Ottawa encourages all our members and their employees to download the COVID Alert App to protect yourself and your community. It is not a tracking system but rather, a warning system for you and everyone around you.

With the free COVID Alert app, you can:

- get a notification if you may have been exposed to COVID-19
- get advice on what to do next
- tell nearby app users if you test positive for COVID-19, without sharing any personal information

COVID Alert will not:

- collect, store or access any personal data, or health information
- tell you if you're currently near someone who's tested positive
- tell you about outbreaks in your city or neighborhood

Liberals Replace CERB with New Simplified El Benefit

OTTAWA — The federal Liberals are rolling out a \$37-billion income-support plan for workers whose earnings have crashed during the pandemic. The details released today outline what will happen to some four million workers receiving the \$500-a-week Canada Emergency Response Benefit, which is set to wind down

starting this month. The CERB will be extended four weeks, and a new benefit that pays \$400 a week for up to 26 weeks will replace it for those ineligible for employment insurance. Anyone eligible for EI will get the same minimum for at least 26 weeks and will need to have worked 120 hours to qualify, well below current EI requirements, since many Canadians have been unable to work to the pandemic.

There will also be \$500-a-week sickness benefit and caregiving benefit for anyone who has to stay home because they're ill, or because school or daycare is closed. The three new benefits are expected to cost \$22 billion and will be brought in through legislation once the House of Commons returns after being prorogued this week. The CERB extension is expected to cost a further \$8 billion, and \$7 billion more to the EI system, and can be done through powers that Employment Minister Carla Qualtrough already has to create temporary EI measures. Government officials estimate about one million people will need the new workers' benefit that replaces the CERB, and three million will go onto the simplified EI program.
